Class of Membership

Section 1

Currently Reads:

There shall be six classes of membership: Honorary Life, Active, Spouse, Social, Provisional and Affiliated. The membership card issued to all but Affiliated shall designate the type of membership held. Honorary Life, Active, Social, Provisional and Affiliated classes of membership shall include the Spouse membership; however the Spouse privileges shall be limited to the purchase of bar and food items only. The spouse shall have no work hour responsibilities, and shall have no voting rights. The membership of the spouse shall automatically cease upon the resignation or termination of the member or upon the divorce or dissolution of a member and spouse. In the event of the death of a member the membership privileges of the spouse under this article shall cease, however a spouse shall have the option to assume membership of the deceased spouse as set forth under Article XX

Changed to Read:

There shall be seven classes of membership: Honorary Life, Active, Spouse, Significant Other. Social, Provisional and Affiliated. The membership card issued to all but Affiliated shall designate the type of membership held. Honorary Life, Active, Social, Provisional and Affiliated classes of membership shall include the Spouse and Significant Other membership; however the Spouse and Significant Other privileges shall be limited to the purchase of bar and food items only. The spouse and Significant Other shall have no work hour responsibilities, and shall have no voting rights. The membership of the spouse and Significant Other shall automatically cease upon the resignation or termination of the member or upon the divorce or dissolution of a member and spouse. In the event of the death of a member the membership privileges of the spouse and Significant Other under this article shall cease, however a spouse shall have the option to assume membership of the deceased spouse as set forth under Article XX

Letter to the Membership,

Constitution Amendment:

Dock and Harbor Rules, Section Three.

Currently reads: When approved by the Board any Member (or Provisional Member) using a dock space for the period from November 15th to April 1st of the following year shall pay dock fees for this or her period of \$2.00 per foot based on the length of the boat.

Amendment Proposal: When approved by the Board any Member (or Provisional Member) using a dock space for the period from November 15th to April 1st of the following year shall pay the previous summer monthly dock rate prorated for the 4.5 winter months. (Example: \$300 summer dock fee divided by the 7.5 summer months equals \$40 a month times 4.5 winter months equaling \$180.)
