"Use of Ethanol Gasoline in Marine Engines"



As you may know, refiners are expanding the distribution of ethanol blended gasoline to meet recent federal requirements. This includes gasoline sold at marinas.

ValvTect Marine Gasoline is the only gasoline specially formulated to prevent problems caused by ethanol. However, due to higher moisture in the marine environment and due to certain incompatible fuel system components used in some older boats, you must also properly prepare your fuel system before switching to fuel containing ethanol or you may experience problems even when using ValvTect Marine Gasoline

Because of these concerns about ethanol, ValvTect wants to provide important information to help make the transition smoother and help prevent ethanol related problems.

Phase Separation

Ethanol attracts water. Gasoline tanks containing more than 0.35% water are at risk of having ethanol phase separate into an alcohol and water layer at the bottom of the tank. When this happens, the fuel's top layer contains reduced level of high octane ethanol and a reduced substantially octane gasoline. Engines are not able to effectively burn the lower octane fuel efficiently or the alcohol and water mixture. Do not attempt to "fix" this fuel! the fuel must be properly discarded.

In order to avoid phase separation, make certain there is no water in the boat's gasoline tank before fueling with ethanol blends. Refuel only when the gasoline level is less than ¼ tank, especially during the first and second fill after transition.

Storage of Ethanol Gasoline.

If a boat is to be stored for more than 60 days, it is recommended the tank be filled to 7/8th capacity with ValvTect Marine Gasoline which is specially formulated to keep the fuel stabile and provide moisture control. This will also help avoid moisture build-up and allow for expansion. Non ValvTect Gasoline should be treated with ValvTect Marine Fuel Stabilizer or ValvTect Ethanol Gasoline Treatment.

Fiberglass Fuel Tanks

Gasoline containing 10% ethanol has been documented to cause a chemical reaction with certain resins used in some fiberglass fuel tanks. This can result in a deterioration of tank walls and, in extreme cases, leakage with the risk of causing an explosion. In addition, the resin absorbed in the fuel can plate on intake valves. This may result in engine failure.

It is STRONGLY recommended that boaters contact their boat manufacturer to make sure their fuel tank is compatible with ethanol fuel. Older Bertram, Tripp Angler, and Hatteras are some of the boat manufacturers that used these fiberglass fuel tanks and have had tank failure problems.

Solvent Characteristics of Ethanol

Ethanol acts as a solvent which will breakdown any deposits and sediment buildup in your fuel tank or fuel system. All Certified ValvTect Marinas were advised to pump out all water and/or sediment in their gasoline storage tanks and install special ethanol compatible fuel filters prior to taking delivery of ethanol gasoline.

We recommend that boaters carry additional ethanol compatible fuel filters and tools needed to replace fuel filters in the event a filter becomes clogged. In addition, it is advised that boaters check with their marine dealer or engine manufacturer to be sure the fuel filter being used is suitable for 10% ethanol gasoline.

Rubber Components

Older engines and their fuel systems components may be susceptible to ethanol damage.

We suggest that all rubber components exposed to fuel on both new and older boats be inspected on a yearly basis and replaced immediately if necessary by an experienced mechanic.

Fuel Quality

Follow your marine engine manufacturer's recommendations for minimum octane levels. Use ValvTect Marine Gasoline sold only at Certified ValvTect Marinas. to provide the best possible performance and protection against ethanol related problems. Non-ValvTect marine gasoline should be treated with ValvTect Ethanol Gasoline Treatment available in aftermarket containers.

We encourage you to further research this topic through your marinas, marine engine builders, boat/tank manufacturers, Boat U.S., boating magazines, marine associations, and websites.

BVYC Historical Article

Maumee Bay

Maumee Bay has changed very much in the last one hundred years. Before there were disposal areas and causeways and mud banks flanking the current channel, the natural channel wound its way from the river mouth to "deep water" west of Turtle Island. From the river mouth that channel veered left in the area of the cut between Squadron Is and Grassy Is., went parallel to the Point Place shore before turning east off Carland Beach, rejoining the current channel at about buoy 40 and following the channel out to about buoy 34, then turning north to Turtle Is.

This chart is from 1900 and shows the new straight channel as well as the old. Five sets of ranges, one at Ironville (current overseas shipping docks), two in Point Place, and two out in



the bay where the old channel turned north, helped vessels navigate this snaky natural channel. The new straight channel was 18 feet deep. This is why the Harbor Light is where it is. When built in 1904 it was at the outer end of the channel. Several times from the '30's to the '60's the channel was deepened to 21, 25, and eventually to 28 feet. Each time it also had to be lengthened so that now the Harbor Light is about in the middle of the bay channel. A set of ranges was added as the channel was lengthened. The Maumee Bay range was built in the center of the channel near present day buoy 34 on a 1200 foot long pile and concrete crib. After many collisions between ships navigating

around this obstruction and between ships and the crib itself, it was removed in the early 1960's. The dredged material from the deepening projects were pumped to an area parallel to and about 2000 feet away from the channel, creating a series of islands and shoals on both sides of the channel. These islands were tree covered and home to many gulls and terns. High water and NE storms during the '70's eroded them away and left the hidden shoals that keep Erie Propeller and South Shore Towing in business even today!

In 1962 the causeway from Cullen Park to Squadron Is. was built to allow rock to be trucked out for the construction of Grassy Is. disposal area. After its completion the portion of the road from Squadron to Grassy was removed to allow water flow and small boat access to North Maumee Bay. The larger disposal area on the east side of the channel past Harbor View was built in the mid '70's.

The north shore of the lagoon was also different. Originally an island, it was a thin strip of land paralleling the current road to the Coast Guard. The land was built out with dredge fill from the river channel and our lagoon. The shoreline was at the current tree line across the road from our club house and a channel existed from our lagoon to the bay at about dock 110. This channel was bridged in the early 1930's and filled in during the late 1940's.
