My dock is located in front of the club, right in front of the anchor, so for me when the water level is at 68 inches I know I will be steeping in a couple inches of water to get to my dock but the rest of the dock will be dry. Members please take the time to come check your boats with the varying water levels to decide where your critical water level is for your boat.

Boating Technology - You gotta love technology. Today we can text a buoy and receive water and weather data. I recommend you create a new contact called Weather Buoy 45165. The phone number is 866-218-9973. Then create a text message to Weather Buoy. In the text field, put in 45165 and hit send. That's why you put 45165 in the contact name so you remember what to put in the text field. In seconds you will receive weather and wave data from the buoy that sits out in front of Meineke's marina. I believe there are others as well but that's the only one I'm familiar with. Also, one of the best Apps I've found is called Sail Flow. It's meant for sail boaters but works great for any type of boating. It basically will tell you the forecasted winds for your area. Download the app from your phone store then launch it. You will see small arrows on a map. Touch on one of the arrows then click on forecast. Then you will see projected wind speeds and directions for the next week as well as the weather outlook. 
